¹⁴ But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have become convinced of, because you know those from whom you learned it, ¹⁵ and how from infancy you have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. ¹⁶ All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness ¹⁷ so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work. 4 In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who will judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing and his kingdom, I give you this charge: ² preach the word; be prepared in season and out of season; correct, rebuke and encourage – with great patience and careful instruction. ³ For the time will come when people will not put up with sound doctrine. Instead, to suit their own desires, they will gather round them a great number of teachers to say what their itching ears want to hear. ⁴ They will turn their ears away from the truth and turn aside to myths. ⁵ But you, keep your head in all situations, endure hardship, do the work of an evangelist, discharge all the duties of your ministry.

Bishop says community needs to know that churches are open and ready to welcome people back

The Clogher Diocesan Synod was held in St Macartin's Cathedral Hall, Enniskillen, on Thursday, 29th September. The Synod commenced with A Service of Holy Communion in St. Macartin's Cathedral.

The Bishop of Clogher, the Right Revd Dr Ian Ellis, presided at his first Synod in person since his election as bishop.

In his presidential address, Bishop Ellis said the church is now on the reconstruction phase as it rebuilds from the Coronavirus pandemic.

He told parish representatives attending: "We had good safety reasons for holding back from offering our full programme of activities in parish life, but, now is the time to open the doors of our halls and all our organisations to restart and hopefully flourish again. Now is the time to make some noise to tell the community that churches are open, and that we want to welcome people in."

He encouraged those involved in parishes to be as creative as they can to reach into parish communities and help parishioners reconnect with church life, saying it will take effort and grace and leading of the Holy Spirit.
