### <u>READINGS for —SUNDAY 27th November 2022</u> The Lesson:—Isaiah 2: 1-5

The first Reading is from the Book of the Prophet, Isaiah Chapter 2, beginning to read at verse 1.

This is what Isaiah son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem: <sup>2</sup> In the last days the mountain of the LORD's temple will be established as the highest of the mountains; it will be exalted above the hills, and all nations will stream to it. <sup>3</sup> Many peoples will come and say, 'Come, let us go up to the mountain of the LORD, to the temple of the God of Jacob. He will teach us his ways, so that we may walk in his paths.' 



# Running rector already exceeds fundraising target for new prayer garden.



A Church of Ireland rector has decided to take to road running to obtain sponsorship for a new learning resource at her local primary school. The Revd Rebecca Guildea, Rector of the parishes of

Garrison, Slavin, Belleek and Kiltyclogher in Clogher Diocese, is running a four—mile distance, the same as the distance between her rectory and Belleek Primary School, 40 times over the three months from September to December.

The individual runs are being sponsored by parishioners. With a target to raise £500, she has already exceeded that amount already – almost doubling it to £950.

Rebecca's aim is that her churches will contribute to the cost of establishing a prayer garden at the school. A rundown activity area at the school will be transformed into an outdoor learning space and prayer garden where children can grow their own vegetables and flowers and also have reflective space. Rebecca explained that the Church of Ireland Board of Education (Northern Ireland) has earmarked £1,000 for the project with the remaining £1,000 required to be raised locally. As Rebecca sets out on several of her four-mile runs several times each week, she reflects on making the connection between church and school stronger.

"My real wish is how our church can be a blessing in our community and how to make useful connections within it," she said.

Rebecca and her husband Brendan have three children, Noah, Isaac and Moses with Noah already attending Belleek School.



# <u>Irish Inter–Church</u> <u>Meeting considers</u> <u>church life after</u> <u>Pandemic.</u>

The thirty–second meeting of the Irish Inter–Church Meeting (IICM) took place on Thursday, 10th November, and

Friday, 11th November, in Dromantine Conference Centre, Newry. The theme for the meeting was 'Creatively reconfiguring our post–pandemic understanding of church'. Representatives from across the island gathered to reflect together on how churches can connect with a changed post–pandemic world.

Prof. John Fitzgerald (TCD) began by tracing the story from Jan 2020 to Nov 2022, giving an analysis of the impact of the Covid–19 pandemic on society on the island of Ireland.

Participants then reflected on a changing local church, led by Breige O'Hare (from the <u>First Step Well</u> counselling and support service), who provided opportunities to prayerfully reflect on the impact of these changing and challenging times on those working in ministry at local level. She focussed in particular on the importance of churches creating space for people to deepen robust, honest relationships with Christ and with each other in these anxious times.

While the Covid–19 pandemic has affected us greatly on this island, its impact for our brothers and sisters in the global church has been significantly different – it was often another amongst many crises. Speakers Bob Kikuyu of Christian Aid (Kenya) and Dr Conchita Reyes of Trócaire (Guatemala) shared about the situation in their countries.

With Orthodox and Migrant–Led churches represented in the Irish Council of Churches membership, a panel discussion between Fr Anish John (Indian Orthodox) and Pastor Dare Adetuberu (Redeemed Christian Church of God), joined by Ruth Garvey–Williams (editor of <u>Vox magazine</u>) highlighted what the distinctive impact of the pandemic has been for them, and at grassroots across the country. Finally Joe McKeown, Youthlink's Research and Curriculum Development Officer, facilitated a panel of young people from <u>YouthLink</u> who shared their perspective on the Covid–19 pandemic, and its effects on their day–to–day and social lives.
