READINGS for —SUNDAY 8th January 2023

The Lesson:—Isaiah 42: 1-9

The first Reading is from the Book of the Prophet, Isaiah Chapter 42, beginning to read at verse 1.

'Here is my servant, whom I uphold,
my chosen one in whom I delight;
I will put my Spirit on him,
and he will bring justice to the nations.
He will not shout or cry out,
or raise his voice in the streets.
A bruised reed he will not break,
and a smouldering wick he will not snuff out.
In faithfulness he will bring forth justice;
he will not falter or be discouraged
till he establishes justice on earth.
In his teaching the islands will put their hope.'

This is what God the LORD says —
the Creator of the heavens, who stretches them out,
who spreads out the earth with all that springs from it,
who gives breath to its people,
and life to those who walk on it:
'I, the LORD, have called you in righteousness;
I will take hold of your hand.
I will keep you and will make you
to be a covenant for the people
and a light for the Gentiles,
to open eyes that are blind,
to free captives from prison
and to release from the dungeon those who sit in darkness.

'I am the LORD; that is my name!
I will not yield my glory to another or my praise to idols.
See, the former things have taken place, and new things I declare; before they spring into being I announce them to you.'

The Epistle:- Acts 10: 34-43

The Epistle Reading is from the Book of Acts, Chapter 10, beginning to read at verse 34.

Then Peter began to speak: 'I now realise how true it is that God does not show favouritism but accepts from every nation the one who fears him and does what is right. You know the message God sent to the people of Israel, announcing the good news of peace through Jesus Christ, who is Lord of all. You know what has happened throughout the province of Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached – how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power, and how he went around doing good and healing all who were under the power of the devil, because God was with him.

'We are witnesses of everything he did in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They killed him by hanging him on a cross, but God raised him from the dead on the third day and caused him to be seen. He was not seen by all the people, but by witnesses whom God had already chosen – by us who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one whom God appointed as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name.'

This is the Word of the Lord.

The Gospel Reading—Matthew 3: 13-17

Hear the Gospel of our Saviour Christ, according to Saint Matthew, chapter 3, beginning to read at verse 13.

Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

Then Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to be baptised by John. But John tried to deter him, saying, 'I need to be baptised by you, and do you come to me?'





THE EPIPHANY CAROL SERVICE and PROCESSION

INTRODUCTION

This service explores a rich tapestry of Epiphany themes.

The word Epiphany means 'showing forth' or 'manifestation'. The Feast of the Epiphany (6 January) is the occasion on which the Church celebrates the showing forth of the child Jesus to the Gentiles. But the Epiphany season recalls two other significant 'manifestations'. One is the baptism of Jesus in the River Jordan by John the Baptist. The other is Jesus' first miracle, or 'sign' – the turning of water into wine at the wedding at Cana in Galilee. Each of these 'manifestations' shows us something of who Jesus is: His meeting with the Wise Men reveals him as Saviour of the world, his baptism confirms his identity as God's Son, and the miracle at Cana points to Jesus as the one who brings about the New Creation.

This Epiphany procession recalls these three manifestations of Jesus through Scripture, music, space and movement – and in so doing helps deepen our understanding of the mystery of God who, in Jesus, shares our life by taking human flesh.

The Epiphany procession may be held on any suitable occasion between the Feast of the Epiphany (6 January) and the Feast of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple (2 February), though perhaps most appropriately on the Festival of the Baptism of Christ.

The Department of Fiction in the RCB Library

For a small and niche Library, it often comes as a surprise to visitors at the vast amount of print material that is held on site. At the moment, there are currently nearly 60,000 print items catalogued on the Library's online system. During the pandemic, Library staff used the opportunity presented by remote working to continue to retrospectively catalogue the large number of print items that were not present on the Library's online catalogue. A large percentage of these items are classed in the literature section. Being able to devote this time in a systematic fashion allowed Library staff to gain a valuable insight into how the Library developed, from its initial incarnation as the Feenish/Ardfeenish Library (sometimes called Leabharlann an Chomhluadair on its bookplates) through to its eventual incorporation as the


Representative Church Body Library in 1932.

Our Archive of the Month explores this development, looking at Rosamond Stephen's role in the founding of the Guild of Witness and the Guild's library, as well as her successor Geraldine FitzGerald. The novels that make up this part of the Library's collection are very much of their time, and were added to the collection in order to inform the moral and spiritual education of contemporary members. Given this, it is no surprise to see collections of the work of Jane Austen, Charles Dickens and Leo Tolstoy among others, particularly in items accessioned in the very early part of the 20th century, particularly by the Guild of Witness Library. An area of particular interest to Rosa-

mond Stephen at this time was that of historical fiction. Indeed, Stephen kept individual handwritten books tracking accessions of this genre, as well as what novels were being read by members. During the 1930s and Geraldine FitzGerald's time as Librarian, we see the introduction of contemporary novels.

The article also tells the story of those who donated substantial items to the Library, and the importance of donations to building the print collection as a whole, as well as the literature section specifically. The article looks at two important donors to the early Library, Ethel Goddard and Linda Hillas, both of whose generous bequest made a significant contribution to adding to the original 5,000 items that were donated by by Stephen from the Guild of Witness Library.
