READINGS for —SUNDAY 5th March 2023

The Lesson:—Genesis 12: 1-4

The first Reading is from the Book of Genesis, Chapter 12, beginning to read at verse 1.

The Lord had said to Abram, 'Go from your country, your people and your father's household to the land I will show you.

'I will make you into a great nation, and I will bless you;
I will make your name great, and you will be a blessing.
I will bless those who bless you, and whoever curses you I will curse; and all peoples on earth will be blessed through you.'

So Abram went, as the Lord had told him; and Lot went with him. Abram was seventy -five years old when he set out from Harran.

This is the Word of the Lord.

Thanks be to God.

The Epistle:- Romans 4: 1-5, 13-17

The Epistle Reading is from the letter of St. Paul to the Romans, Chapter 4. reading from verse 1.

What then shall we say that Abraham, our forefather according to the flesh, discovered in this matter? If, in fact, Abraham was justified by works, he had something to boast about – but not before God. What does Scripture say? 'Abraham believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness.'

Now to the one who works, wages are not credited as a gift but as an obligation. However, to the one who does not work but trusts God who justifies the ungodly, their faith is credited as righteousness.

It was not through the law that Abraham and his offspring received the promise that he would be heir of the world, but through the righteousness that comes by faith. For if those who depend on the law are heirs, faith means nothing and the promise is worthless, because the law brings wrath. And where there is no law there is no transgression. Therefore, the promise comes by faith, so that it may be by grace and may be guaranteed to all Abraham's offspring – not only to those who are of the law but also to those who have the faith of Abraham. He is the father of us all. As it is written: 'I have made you a father of many nations.' He is our father in the sight of God, in whom he believed – the God who gives life to the dead and calls into being things that were not.

This is the Word of the Lord.

The Gospel Reading—Matthew 17: 1-9

(Sung Acclamation)

Hear the Gospel of our Saviour Christ, according to Saint Matthew, chapter 17, beginning to read at verse 1.

Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

After six days Jesus took with him Peter, James and John the brother of James, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. There he was transfigured before them. His face shone like the sun, and his clothes became as white as the light. Just then there appeared before them Moses and Elijah, talking with Jesus.

Peter said to Jesus, 'Lord, it is good for us to be here. If you wish, I will put up three shelters – one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.'

While he was still speaking, a bright cloud covered them, and a voice from the cloud said, 'This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased. Listen to him!'

When the disciples heard this, they fell face down to the ground, terrified. But Jesus came and touched them. 'Get up,' he said. 'Don't be afraid.' When they looked up, they saw no one except Jesus.

As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus instructed them, 'Don't tell anyone what you have seen, until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord.



A 6.4 magnitude earthquake struck Turkey (officially known as Türkiye) at 20.04 local time (17.04 GMT) on Monday, 20 February. It follows two powerful earthquakes, which struck in southern Türkiye (Turkey) and northern Syria on Monday, 6 February. News is still unfolding about further damage and injury caused by the third earthquake near the city of Antakya, which was followed by multiple aftershocks.

The initial two earthquakes <u>killed over 50,000</u> people. A further <u>70,000</u> were injured following the two powerful earthquakes.
