*The New Testament reading is written in the Letter of St. Paul
to the Colossians, in the 1st chapter beginning at the 16th verse.*

For in him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things have been created through him and for him. He is before all things, and in him all things hold together. And he is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning and the firstborn from among the dead, so that in everything he might have the supremacy. For God was pleased to have all his fullness dwell in him, and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through his blood, shed on the cross. Once you were alienated from God and were enemies in your minds because of your evil behaviour.

The Gospel reading

*Hear the Gospel of our Saviour, Christ according to St Luke,
chapter 4, beginning at verse 16.*

Glory to you , Lord Jesus Christ.

He went to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, and on the Sabbath day he went into the synagogue, as was his custom. He stood up to read, and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was handed to him. Unrolling it, he found the place where it is written:

‘The Spirit of the Lord is on me,
because he has anointed me
to proclaim good news to the poor.

He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners
and recovery of sight for the blind,
to set the oppressed free,
to proclaim the year of the Lord’s favour.’

Then he rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant and sat down. The eyes of everyone in the synagogue were fastened on him. He began by saying to them, ‘Today this scripture is fulfilled in your hearing.’

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

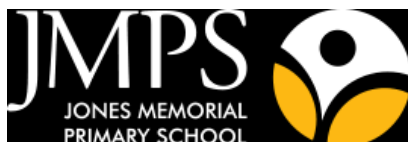

Please place your collected tops in the box in the front porch in Church.

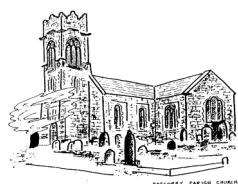

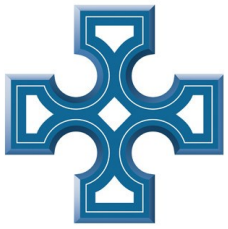

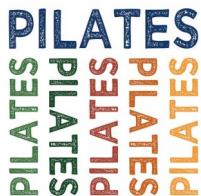

A MESSAGE FROM THE RECTOR

As we gather together in Rossorry this weekend, so we celebrate the historic events for the coronation of The King and The Queen Consort. This is a time for the nation to unite in prayer. For the Church of Ireland this is not a singular event. It has always been our practice in both Morning & Evening Prayer and in the Celebration of Holy Communion to pray for both Church and State as we pray for the Monarch and their Government. Scripture has much to say on this practice and we are reminded that St Paul, in his first letter to Timothy, said:

‘First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people, for kings and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way.’ (1 Timothy 2: 1-2)

So we make this our prayer for today and throughout our King’s reign. The mood of this weekend is one of joy and celebration as we make time to worship and pray and to join in fellowship in celebrations like so many throughout the Nation. There is something to suit all ages in our Afternoon Tea and Barbecue. Our Uniformed organisations will parade their National flags into church and our Sunday School children will join in a fancy dress parade to ensure their inclusion, making memories they will carry with them throughout their lives. As I have visited throughout the parish these last days so many senior parishioners have reminisced with much fondness their own memories of the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth II in 1953. I wish you all every blessing and God’s hand of protection upon you if you travel to be with family, and safety as you attend public events. May this weekend be one of happiness and celebration in which we share in God’s blessing of the King.
